**DISCLOSURE OF STUDENT DIRECTORY INFORMATION  
TO MILITARY RECRUITERS**

Re: Denial of Access to Military Recruiters

Federal law requires secondary schools to release the names, addresses, and telephone numbers of secondary school students to military recruiters who request this information unless you have advised your principal or administrator that you do not want this information disclosed without your prior written consent. You have the right to request that this information is not released to military recruiters. You may prohibit the release of this information to military recruiters by completing this form.

I object to the release of the name, address, or telephone number of:

Federal public law 107-110, section 9528 of the ESEA, "No Child Left Behind Act" requires school districts to release student names, addresses, and telephone numbers to military recruiters upon their request. This assists recruiters in making contacts with these students and their families. The law also requires the school district to notify you of your right to opt out from this by requesting that the district not release your information to military recruiters. The completion and return of this form serves as your request to withhold your private information.
